## **Introduction**

Spam Safe Mail is a cloud based email spam filtering service on the Internet that is scanning your company's inbound email **before** it reaches your email server.

The advantages of an Internet based filtering service are two fold, better protection for your own email server, and more importantly, many other users across many other clients are all contributing to ensure that the filter is more accurate. However, in the event that the filter makes a mistake, you can have an inbound email redelivered to you and this is explained later in this document.

Our aim with Spam Safe Mail is to provide a high class filter, allowing you to easily fight against the receiving of spam emails, and gain control over your mail box again. You will find that your time spent in "checking your emails" will be reduced, which is important in business. Additionally, when checking the spam bin, you will see that you can quickly scan down the list of emails in the spam bin within seconds.

## Obtaining a username and PIN

If your Administrator has setup your domain name to allow automatic signup, you can have a PIN to the system allocated and emailed to you, see the next section. If not, you will need to contact them. You will need go to the login page of the main Spam Safe Mail system at:-

If however, you already have a PIN but have forgotten it. Then enter your email address into the Username field and click the "Forgotten Password..." button. Your PIN will be returned to you by email.



By simply scanning the last (most right handed column), it is possible to see if any emails were falsely filtered in error. If they were, then the sender will have also received an error message to “make contact by telephone”. If you receive such a telephone call, then, look in the Spam Bin for the email.

Click on the emails subject (right most column) to open it and safely view the email.

**Please note:** That all links, images, attachments and layout are safely blocked, and you can read the raw message text.

## Viewing a message in the Spam Bin safely

Click on the email subject (the right most column) to open the email. You will see something like this:-

Clearly, this example is not to a person who wanted this newsletter, and so has been correctly filtered as spam. However, if it was from a contact of yours and was erroneously filtered, and you really wanted this email, then if you click “Redeliver Email”, then the system will redeliver it to you along with any attachments.

**Please note:** That assuming the “Email To:” address is correct, (**Please double check the Email To Address**) that redelivery of emails may take up to 5 minutes. This is because the system will have to go away, find the email, restore it, and then redeliver it to your server, and this too depends on the speed of the link your office has with reference to the size of the email and any attachments.

## Obtaining Help

In the first instance, as a user, you will have an Administrator in your own company, either the IT person or perhaps the business owner. You may also have an external IT support company who will offer you first line support. We suggest that you complete the section at the end of this document with your support contact.
